EFFECTS OF THE PERSISTENT UPLook

The human race always admires its outstanding characters, preferable from afar, for men of genius are rather uncomfortable playmates. The great seem just a little peculiar to the common garden variety of folks, who usually stand in awe of them.

Men we call great are those who have never departed from their working agreement with the Lord, or Something which might be defined as Principle. They are men who have turned back to or who have been thrown back upon their own original resources. Some call this an all-accomplishing Intelligence.

To the unknowing, unusual accomplishments are classed as miracles. This is only because they wonder how such things are done. If they knew, they would no longer wonder. Any intelligent work is a miracle to the uninstructed, but to those who are truly taught, it is the result expected.

We have often said that when any one or any group turns to and depends upon God, mighty works are accomplished. All mighty accomplishments in the world can be traced to the inspiration of some person in a group who translated the ideal to his fellows. The framing of the Constitution of this country was accomplished, in large measure, through inspiration.

Benjamin Franklin, considered at that time to be one of the wisest of our statesmen, was insistent that any attempt to frame a governmental constitution without the aid of Divine guidance would cause the participants eventually to become the laughing stock of all nations.

It has always been true that if any project is at all worthwhile, we can know positively that God is in it and must be acknowledged. In every body of men there is always one who looks just a little higher than his companions. His influence is felt and his name remembered to the degree of his uplook toward and his obedient co-operation with an Intelligence higher than his own mind.

In the instance of framing the Constitution, the accumulated wisdom of the great men involved was brought into a common storehouse for the general welfare of the government being established, and we know many of those men looked to God for guidance.

The process involved in any great undertaking is always the same. The Scriptures are filled with instruction; the challenge to attainment is clear-cut. It is, "Look." "Look unto Me." "Return unto Me, and I will return unto you.."

People looking to exalted egos for their success are becoming disillusioned and will become more so even though there seem to be brief advantages gained. The deflated ego is a pitiful thing; but the exalted Principle is beautiful to behold. As this nation has endured because its founding was ushered into being by a spiritual urge and a divine directing impulse, just so will every man build wisely who turns to the Lord.

In turning, a man need not be circumscribed by former religious concepts, or even past concepts of truth. The instruction of the Holy Spirit is not subject to the approval of some prevalent popular magazine, an exalted

potentate, or public opinion. A man need not be bound and fettered by any former presentation of things spiritual. If it was good, it has already done its good work, it has already proved effective.

"God has not lost His ancient magic touch." Nor has He surrendered His ability to form and re-form ruling world powers, and penetrate the minds and hearts of His people with His saving Presence. God will and does stand by those who stand before Him.

A direct revelation of the Presence of God to the individual consciousness is better than reams of doctrine and libraries of instruction. Every man comes into this world to awaken to his relationship to this Presence. Jesus Christ clearly defined this relationship: I and my Father are ONE.

Christianity has been much maligned and cruelly misrepresented. Christianity understood becomes the way of truth. The way of truth is not cumbered with much traffic. To the average individual it seems to be an isolated stretch and so narrow that he has difficulty in keeping balanced enough to remain in the way. However, those who tread the way report much greater progress and actually less discomfort than that experienced in the more popular and congested highways.

The way of truth is good. Much flexibility of opinion as to what constitutes good is prevalent in the world. The good thought, the good word, the good act; all have been taught as the right rule of behaviorism. Back of these, however, is the motive which governs and influences results. Is God the motive? If the motive is God, good will come out of it.

The good thought acts as a magnet to draw other good thoughts. Every heart responds to a good word sincerely spoken. A good act is applauded on every hand. All true descriptions engender silent acquiescence. Every mind would be delighted to hear truth if it were permitted. We have become confused because we see unsavory practice on the part of exponents of truth. We hear calls of, Lo here, and, Lo there. One advocate declares, You must die to know. Another proclaims, Your attainment is the secret.

Many stumbling blocks are in the way through the world. Eventually we discover, after years of struggle with the world's way, the many "ifs" and "buts" in the covenants we have signed with man-manipulated concepts concerning what is good. The siren call of well-arranged tours to realms celestial is difficult to resist. But such tours have one thing in common: they culminate at their starting points, for the point of departure and the point of arrival are one.

However, one tour is guaranteed to deliver the traveler to a place different for the one he left. This tour, conducted by a Guide who has proved His worth, is not so popular as we are wont to believe. Even the nearest of His associates lost heart at times. It is recorded in John 6:66-69,

"From that time many of His disciples went back and walked no more with Him. Then said Jesus unto the twelve, Will ye also go away? Then Simon Peter answered Him and said, To whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ the Son of the living God."

It sounds egotistical to read into prescribed religion a higher order of belief and a greater working efficiency than is commonly accepted. Such

audacity is offensive. But if any phase of the Christian religion is true to the doctrine upon which it is based, it must admit of a more efficient working of the Principle than is commonly taught.

There must be something more desirable for everybody than the age-old practice of beginning and ending. Birth, a span of life, and death must cease to be the ruling elements in the life of man. If man thinks this is his life, he is putting his hope on falsehood and comes to an expected end. Such a life is an unsolved experiment, which, if solved would reveal a conclusion of fact transcending the experiment itself. Any experiment is made to prove a point in truth, to reveal a hidden splendor of fact that remains obscure until the experiment is successfully concluded. The principle of mathematics works whenever it is worked; Spirit works whenever it is invoked.

If any phase of religion is true to the Principle within it, it cannot help but attest to a higher understanding of the reality of being, a higher level of existence right where man is, not to be attained in some future time.

The word of life is the word of eternal life. Life is God active, from everlasting to everlasting. The life that lives you, and the life that lives me, is the same life; it is eternal for it is the activity of God in both of us. We live, move and have our being in life. We cannot get out of life, though we may fail in our experiment to prove this point. But our failure does not make eternal life untrue. For the truth of it does not fail. Declaration of truth defeats failure.

Whoever has the word of life is constantly in acknowledgment of life. He thinks, speaks, and acts in terms of life; vital, positive life. Whoever speaks of saving souls before they die acknowledges death and is going in the direction of death. This falsehood is diametrically opposed to life and to God. Whoever speaks of hell-fire and damnation is a servant of hell-fire and damnation and is moving away from God. He will wind up at his starting point, drawing with him all who listen.

Whoever speaks of heaven now, salvation now, is going where he is looking. Starting with that objective, there will be rest when his tour is completed. "My words ... are life unto those that find them." We are instructed definitely to choose life. "And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent."

This knowing must be more than worship of a man, or passive acknowledgment of a doctrine. This knowing comes from living a life; a perception and appreciation of all life as God. God is the life of all things, animate and inanimate.

Certain religious practices consider it quite a triumph if a sinner acknowledges God before he dies. This itself is an indictment of such systems. They are recognizing the triumph of death over life, which is not true. The man they claim to worship decried any such concept as of value. "If a man keep my saying, he shall never see death."

The word of life is potent. It knows how to live and how to adjust conditions to its mode of living. Speak the word of life and watch the response in those for whom you speak. If love of God accompanies your word, the response will be permanent. You will find yourself doing good works through the simple expedient of using the right word.

Exercise of your spiritual prerogatives may not make you the most popular person in your community, but you will be a saving presence among your fellows. Press on in His Name and they will seek you out when they need you. Like Benjamin Franklin you might insist, silently of course, that any progress hoped to be made rests upon consideration of the things of God first. When these possess the minds and hearts of all people, all things will work together for good, and good effects will be lasting.
